

2010 Missouri Legislative Status Report

TOURISM

HB 1272 (Bruns)	Increases the rate that all counties and certain cities are authorized to impose, upon voter approval, or a transient guest tax on each occupied room, per night from up to 5% to up to 7%. STATUS: Introduced
HB 1323 (Bringer)	Requires the certificate of title for a new outboard motor to contain both the year the motor was manufactured and the year the dealer received the motor from the manufacturer. STATUS: Introduced
HB 1367 (Schlottach)	Allows any winery, distiller, manufacturer, wholesaler or brewer to provide beverage samples on certain licensed retail premises for tasting purposes. STATUS: Introduced
HB 1378 (Salva)	Modifies the definition of "restaurant bar" as it relates to the sale of liquor on Sundays. STATUS: Introduced
HB 1388 (Day)	Authorizes the City of Waynesville to impose, upon voter approval, a transient guest tax for a multipurpose conference and convention center. STATUS: Introduced
HB 1412 (McGhee)	Establishes in statute the Missouri State Park Board which is responsible for managing the Historical Marker Program. STATUS: Introduced
HB 1557 (Kelly)	Authorizes the City of Ashland to impose, upon voter approval, a transient guest tax for the promotion of tourism. STATUS: Introduced
HB 1567 (Meiners)	Allows the City of Grandview to impose a transient guest tax. STATUS: Introduced
HB 1568 (Salva)	Authorizes the City of Sugar Creek to impose, upon voter approval, a transient guest tax for the promotion of tourism. STATUS: Introduced
HB 1587 (Grill)	Increases the annual cap on the tax credits certified for qualified film production projects from \$4.5 million to \$10 million. STATUS: Introduced
HB 1647 (Cooper)	Changes the classification of certain watercraft from personal property to residential property for property taxation purposes. STATUS: Introduced
HB 1724 (Sutherland)	Authorizes Montgomery County transient guest tax. STATUS: Introduced
SB 644 (Shields)	Modifies provisions of law regarding certain taxes to fund tourism and convention centers. STATUS: Senate Ways and Means Committee
SB 668 (Justus)	Allows the City of Grandview to impose a transient guest tax. STATUS: Senate Economic Development Committee; Hearing Held
SB 700 (Lager)	Authorizes the creation of exhibition center and recreational facility districts in certain counties. STATUS: Senate Economic Development Committee

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SB 703 (Vogel)

Modifies provisions relating to the imposition of transient guest taxes by certain local governments.

STATUS: Senate Commerce Committee

SB 704 (Griesheimer)

Modifies various provisions relating to billboards.

STATUS: Introduced

SB 721 (Nodler)

Requires travel clubs to demonstrate that they have a least \$50,000 in liquid assets, rather than \$250,000.

STATUS: Senate General Laws Committee

SB 745 (Bray)

Creates a statewide energy code for new building construction and renovation.

STATUS: Senate Commerce Committee

SB 746 (Griesheimer)

Imposes various billboard standards to billboards adjacent to Interstate 70 and Interstate 44 during periods of interstate construction.

STATUS: Senate Transportation Committee
